We tried it out this last week with much enthusiasm! The students thoroughly enjoyed adding this as an element to our Daily 3 work/reading time. Learning how to use epic! turned out to be a bit of a computer skills class as well. Epic! is free for us to use during school hours. In class, we will probably use it once or twice a week during our Daily 3 time. Our class code is wgq2853 if you'd like to try it out at home if your child is home sick or home on a day we have off from school.

In 2nd grade we are working on wrapping up our novel study on "Mercy Watson Goes for a Ride." The packet we've been working on will be coming home soon. With this being a shorter week, more practice may be needed at home for spelling words! Thank you!


