Hope everyone had a good weekend and that students enjoyed a bit of extra rest this long weekend! As teachers, we participated in a Pro D Day challenging us to think deeply about the growth of each of our students and how we can support this growth in even more ways in our classrooms. Just like our students, we are always learning.

As we progress in the school year, the reading skills we're learning and developing increase in difficulty. Thank you for continuing to read nightly with your child to reinforce the skills we are learning in class. This practice helps immensely. In first grade, we've learned about open and closed syllables, blends, vowel-consonant-silent e syllables, and now we are beginning vowel team syllables. In second grade, we've covered open and closed syllables, vowel team syllables, R controlled syllables, le syllables, y as a vowel and soft c and soft g. We will soon be moving on to **irregular vowel teams.**
