In our Church History lessons this past week we examined some terms that flowed out of the Enlightenment: gnosticism, scholasticism, humanism, rationalism, and mysticism. These "isms" have all ill affected the work of Jesus Christ and His bride through all the ages. Many heresies have resulted from these terms. It's good to have a deep understanding of these terms to identify the spirits of the times: although perhaps wearing other cloaks, they are still alive and in full persuasion today. Gnosticism, especially, is most prevalent. This results in people "in charge of their own destiny." This week we begin on our Church History focusing on the issues of the Liberation of 1944, and then moving forward from there.

We've now had two Friday morning bible discussions. This past Friday's discussion was led by an 8th grade student. It's such a blessing to watch and listen to the students take responsibility in leading and discussing God's Word.
