~~ Note from Mr. Houweling ~~

In our Church History lessons this past week we examined the effects and influences of the Enlightenment on theologians such as Dr Geelkerken and Dr Kuyper, as well as the power that gripped Synod causing hierarchy, in response to Dr Geelkerken's preaching on the first few chapters of Genesis. Perhaps you have wondered whether the structure we have in our reformed churches of Council - classis - regional synod and General synod is actually a hierarchical system! We say that the Roman Catholic church has a hierarchical system, and that's because each part of the hierarchy rules above each section below it. The Pope is the supreme hierarchical ruling authority over the Roman Catholic church. Each level in the Reformed context serves the church through an advisory capacity, **not** in a ruling capacity. And so anything that comes on the classis table, all the way up to Synod, is put there by the churches for the churches, and each "level" acts as an advisory "committee" to the churches. The local church Council is the single most autonomous ruling authority under Christ, given by our Lord, over His Bride, the Church. In response to Geelkerken, Synod acted in a hierarchical manner as it ruled to depose Geelkerken and his whole consistory! They indeed had the right intentions, but went about it in the wrong way.

I was very excited with the results of our most recent essay based on the book Cue for Treason: Courage in the face of adversity. For the 7th grade, this was their first essay; all students did an excellent job. Feel free to ask your son/daughter to have a read of their essay, the rubric and my grade comment.

This past week the 8th grade students began thinking about their High School and Beyond assignment. The first box is due this Friday.

This week we begin our unit on speeches! Everyone needs to present a speech on a topic of their choice. It would be helpful for you to prompt your child into speech making mode:)
