In math, there are quite a few students who don't know their math facts. The goal is for each student to know their multiplication and division math facts. Students should practice at home. In typing, students have started learning to type with an online program called Typing.com. Student need to practice at least 30 minutes at home each week.

Students are encouraged to complete all their math corrections each night. Parents can mark off corrections at home by using this school link that shows the answers for each math lesson (don't let students mark off their own work): <u>Grade 5-8 Math Lessons 94-120 Answer Keys</u> In reading, students will be part of a Literature Circle group. Students will read from a book they selected. The group will decide how many pages/chapters to read each night. Students need to complete their reading, so they can discuss what they read with the group. For reading goals,

students will set a goal of how many books they will read for this term. Thank you volunteers who have signed up to help with marking and helping students during math.! Have a wonderful week!
