It's amazing how quick the year is progressing. Last week we completed our Bible Studies course. This week we make a start on our Church History course, as well as our Friday Bible Discussion course. This is where students get to shine in terms of active participation. As usual, eighth graders go first in writing an essay on the Bible Chapter being discussed as another eighth grade student leads the discussion. Each week all students need to answer some study questions for the Bible Discussion, as well as come prepared to class with a question to share for the discussion. Students will need to keep a close eye on the schedule.

Planning is underway. Warm Beach here we come! But before I get too carried away, we need some chaperones. As many past chaperones will tell you, this is the field trip to go on: no cooks are required! We're hoping to be gone for **2 days: 3-4th June.** Please let me know ASAP if you are willing and able to come.

As you probably know, Aimsweb testing takes place three times a year: Fall, Winter and Spring. Today we completed the Winter test. Aimsweb is an amazing tool that provides immediate feedback as to the student's learning development in math and English. It allows teachers to see how they compare to their peers as well as national averages. Like all standardized tests, they are a glimpse, a snap-shot, of your child's learning development. Aimsweb also provides the possibility to dig deeper into more in-depth information about each child's ability in these core learning areas, in order to help teachers better help the students where they need it.
