

This week we'll start the week with a test on Tuesday and complete lessons 26 - 28. It will be the turn of some students from 5th grade to enjoy math extensions with Miss Janssen on Friday.

Thank you to all the 5th grade and select 6th grade parents who signed their child up for the Xtra-math program. We wanted everyone in 5th grade to sign up, but after a few sessions we're convinced that some of our students can already graduate from the program. We'll be sending an email to the parents of those who are proficient with their facts to let you know that your child no longer needs to spend the 10 minutes per day online. We will still spend five minutes every class period to keep the facts fresh, and that, along with the math lesson each day, will be enough to keep these students masters of the facts.

We really appreciate parental support for those students that still need to memorize all the math facts (addition/subtraction up to 18 and multiplication/division times tables from 0 to 12). Not knowing these facts is a huge stumbling block in attaining success in any math program. Students need to know their math facts because they act as the building blocks for **more advanced** math concepts, allowing them to solve problems faster and more accurately by freeing up their working memory to focus on complex problem-solving strategies instead of basic calculations. Spending time on Xtramath online is just one way to bolster your child's fact fluency. Making flashcards is another good way, especially since you can target the facts that your child doesn't know.

Tuesday: Practice BAG notes in recorder booklet pages 1 - 5 (challenge/Gr 6: also p. 6-7). ****Focus on posture, hand position and sound production (listen for a good tone!)- see checklist.** ****Students need to practice a minimum of 40 minutes a week.** ****They need to fill in their homework record chart (first page in their recorder folder), and I will ask each student each class how long they practiced at home that week.** ****Musical prizes are awarded for reaching this goal each week!** ****Parents, please remind your child to practice their recorder at home until it becomes a regular routine.** ****Please also remind them put their purple recorder folder in their backpack on Monday nights, so they have it for class on Tuesdays. Thank you!**
