Have you ever reflected on God's majesty? We were recently intrigued that if we were to find all the describing words, in every dictionary and in every language, we would still only just have a glimpse of God's majesty and splendor. He is infinitely greater than language can ever express. We've learned this in BC Art 1 & 2. This knowledge and understanding causes us to respond in reverent awe and wonder: for the sake of His Son, He is my God and my father. All praise and glory belong to Him.

We hope to make a start on analyzing president John Kennedy's famous inaugural speech this week. It's a complex text. A GC assignment will be issued that requires students to skim the text for unfamiliar vocabulary as well as record some pre-reading questions. They then read through the text recording more questions that they might have and finally discuss them with a peer. Assignments will need to be written in formal language with introductions and conclusions; another concept we are learning in other English lessons.

This week and next are four-day weeks. There will be no spelling assignment for next week. This week the spelling and dictation assignments are due on Thursday.


