Thank you for continuing to read nightly with your child to reinforce the skills we are learning in class. This practice helps immensely. In second grade, we are moving right along and have covered open and closed syllables, vowel team syllables, R controlled syllables, le syllables, y as a vowel and soft c and soft g, and vowel teams! We just began a novel study with the book "The Mouse and The Motorcycle."
