Students often look forward to new seating arrangements each month. As the year progresses, they receive increasing responsibilities. Recently, we memorized 1 Corinthians 13, which speaks about growing and maturing into adulthood. I believe we need to provide opportunities for students to develop and demonstrate this maturity. Last month, the desk committee arranged the class into groups, posing a significant challenge to remain focused, avoid distractions, and take on more adult-like behavior and responsibility. While this worked well initially, maintaining that level of conduct consistently proved difficult.

To help students regain their focus, I rearranged the seating to enhance each student's educational journey, ensuring they are not seated next to preferred peers. In working through the challenges of school life, I appreciate this poem: "Do not ask for smoother pathways, but for stronger shoes to wear so that you can climb the mountains and a heavy burden bear. Do not wish for easy times, but for greater courage pray; so that you can meet with joy whatever comes with every day."

This week we finalize our Bible Studies unit where David numbers Israel. Next week we begin our Church History unit, as well as our Bible Discussion lessons--I know students have been looking forward to this!
