

We thrashed that one around this past week and came up with: "English is a communication tool that has a system of rules to enable the communicator and recipient to code and decode one's inner thoughts. It means to commune from heart to heart." It's what God has done with His Word!

Our weekly Friday assessments are progressing well. Kudos to the grade 7s. They're being diligent in keeping up with the homework tasks and studying for assessments. It's hard work, but they're doing well. The workload is nothing new for the 8th grade! However, some have taken a relaxed start to the year and as consequence their grades have suffered! For the most part, it's wondering to see students absorbing and mastering the necessary knowledge and skills. We've been closely examining the use of vivid and sensory terms in our writing, and trying to eradicate certain vocabulary, such as "got", "gotten", "getting" "and then", etc. These are words that we tend to use if we're adopting a lazy attitude to our writing! Being expressive takes conscious thought; it means we need to step outside the box of traditional thinking and come up with words and phrases that's going to invoke such a response in our audience that they're going to want to read more of our works!
