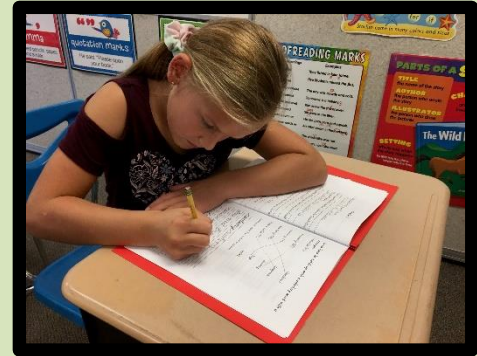

In reading, students are expected to read on their own time from the novel, The Door in the Wall by Marguerite de Angeli. They will be asked questions about their reading. For writing, the students have been introduced to Google classroom where they can work on documents in class or at home. The nice thing about Google Classroom is their work is saved and they don't have to re-write it. It's important that students have access to a computer and can work on their projects at home. Otherwise, they will have to write their work manually and turn it in. This makes it difficult when revisions and edits must be made.

In music, Mrs. Kottelenberg will be teaching on Tuesday. For typing, students need to practice their typing skills for 30 minutes on Typing.com. For PE, the schedule has changed, and students will have PE on Wednesday and Friday right after lunch. In science, students will be working on their prototype of a space crew exploration vehicle (CEV). It's important that they bring their supplies to school. If they don't finish it on Tuesday, they will have to complete it on their own time. We plan to test CEV's this coming Thursday. Have a wonderful week!

There are only a few weeks left to attain the reading goal, and some students are dragging their feet! However, others are building up their points for next term already: good to see ☺
